When I get to Kenya we will start our Orientation on Thursday of this week. Then classes will begin on Friday. We already have 18 who have arrived in Kenya. Please pray for the new students, the faculty and everyone involved that the work in Kenya might go well.

By the way, brother Scott will be staying in Ndola for another week. Please remember him in your prayers that he might have the health and strength to continue teaching and being involved in the new school here.
