Jeremiah had an incredible passion for the word of God. In Jeremiah 20:9, the Bible says, "Then I said, 'I will not make mention of Him, Nor speak anymore in His name.' But His word was in my heart like a burning fire Shut up in my bones; I was weary of holding it back, And I could not." To Jeremiah the word of God was a fire within him, so strong that he could not stop it. He had no power to hold back the word of God. In verse 7 he said that everyone mocked him daily and in verse 8 he said that he was a "reproach and a derision daily." If Jeremiah could, then he might try and hold back his preaching so the people would stop attacking him. Instead he was powerless to stop it. In the end it is easy to see why Jeremiah could have such a strong zeal for God's word. Jeremiah 20:11 reveals this when it says, "But the LORD is with me as a mighty, awesome One. Therefore my persecutors will stumble, and will not prevail. They will be greatly ashamed, for they will not prosper. Their everlasting confusion will never be forgotten." No matter what happened to him, he could continue strong because God was going to protect, guide, and deliver him.

Jeremiah sets out a powerful example for Christians to follow. There are so many things in life which can become someone's passion in life. God's people instead should consider that a passion for the word of God must be a top priority in life. Second Timothy 3:12 says, "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." Everyone who strives to live a godly life will suffer persecution. However, by seeing the excellent model of perseverance that Jeremiah shows we can know with certainty that a Christian can endure the persecution. Truly, no matter how greatly the world might resist, if God's people continue to preach His word then they will be delivered.

The word of God is one of the greatest gifts that is on the earth today. Christians must use it properly by being like Jeremiah who did a challenging work with great zeal.
